


Greens Riding High in the Polls

In the last few months the opinion polls have continually pegged the Green Party at between 5 percent and 11 percent nationally.

In a recent Ipsos-Mori poll, 10 percent of respondents said that they would vote Green. Many other polls have also shown the Greens ahead of the Lib Dems.

The Greens have been polling particularly highly among young voters. A recent YouGov poll found that 22 percent of 18-24-year-olds said they would vote Green. Polls

commissioned by Lord Ashcroft in 2014 also showed promising news for the Green Party in the target constituencies of Brighton Pavilion and Norwich South. The figures all bode very well as we approach the General Election in May.



Green Party Membership Surges

Membership of the Green Party in Britain has surged in the last year. It now stands at over 50,000 - above that of both UKIP & the Lib Dems.

In the East, membership has exceeded 4,000 members, which represents an increase of over 150 percent in the last year. This January alone, over 1000 members joined the party.

Paul Jeater, Regional Fundraising Officer, said:

"I am delighted that so many people have recognised such an affinity with the Greens here in the East that they have decided to join the party. I would like to welcome them to the party at this exciting time leading up to the general election"

The Green surge shows no sign of slowing. The steep membership increase is mirrored by rising polling which sees the Greens riding at their highest levels ahead of a General Election since 1989. Green candidates will be standing in at least 75 percent of seats at the 2015 General Election - 50 percent more than in 2010.

The Green Party outperformed the Liberal Democrats in the May 2014 European Elections, both in terms of MEPs returned and total number of votes.

Green Party leader Natalie Bennett said:

"We are now, with the rapid growth in recent months, in an increasingly strong position to ensure voters understand our message about the need for real change for the common good."
